Parent Involvement Policy

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Anza Elementary School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- Anza School will jointly develop with parents and distribute to parents a Parental Involvement Policy that the school and parents agree on.

Anza Elementary School will implement required school parental involvement policy components as follows:

- Anza School_will submit to the district any parent comments if the school wide plan under section (1114)(b)(2) is not satisfactory to parents: Parents may submit comments in writing regarding the school wide plan to their child's teacher, the Title I Facilitator, the principal, or the appropriate department within Cajon Valley Union School District.

- Anza School will build the school and parents' capacity for strong parental involvement in order to
 ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership between the school,
 parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following

 web sites, parent organizations, and Parent Partnerships
- 2. The school will incorporate the school-parent compact as a component of its School Parental Involvement Policy:
