Description

This course includes a study of a number of Medieval Civilizations focusing on the Geography, Religion, Achievements, Politics, Economics, and Social Structure of each civilization. We will be studying:

- Foundations - Fall of Rome
- Ascendancy - West Africa & Islam
- Christendom - Medieval Europe
- Transformation - Renaissance, Reformation, Scientific Revolution
- Diffusion - China and Japan
- Conquest - Maya, Aztecs, & Incas and Explorers

The following skills will also be covered: Source Reliability, CER (Claim, Evidence and Reason) paragraphs, analyzing primary source documents, and Cornell Notes.

Gradebook

I do not use the district QZangle/Parent Connect program; I use iGradePlus, therefore, you will not find your child's grades posted in Parent Connect. However, you will be able to create an iGradePlus account of your own to be able to view your child's grades 24/7. Be on the lookout for an invitation emailed to you. I will update grades each weekend and send a progress report email home each Monday. The weekly emails will let you know the progress your student is making in my class. 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Late Work

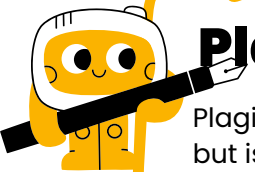
Students are given about two weeks to complete an assignment. At the end of the two weeks, the assignment is closed and cannot be made up for full credit. It can be made up for up to 50% credit. After the progress report, no work from the first half of the trimester will be accepted. All work from the second half of the trimester must be turned in two weeks before the end of that trimester. No late work will be accepted after that.

Assessments



I do not give exams in my classroom. Students show their acquired knowledge through the completion of projects called Adventures. Our end of unit assessment is called Choose Your Own Adventure (CYOA). They will be able to choose from 18 different adventures that vary from a mixture of written, artistic, digital and musical Adventures. Look for my emails regarding CYOAs!
