In May 2024, the State issued updated guidance for Proposition 28, detailing processes for exceptions, approved fund uses, allocation, audit guidelines, and reporting. The Cajon Valley Union School District proceeded cautiously, adopting a phased approach to hiring for positions funded by this program.

At the start of the 2023-24 school year, ten schools, including all CVUSD middle schools and five elementary schools (Avocado, Flying Hills, Fuerte, Madison, and Rancho San Diego), expanded their visual and performing arts programs. Together, they employed 7.24 certified staff members to teach visual art, music, media arts, dance, and/or theater. Students explored various art forms, nurturing creativity and honing skills such as problem-solving, collaboration, and self-confidence. This emphasis on the arts facilitated self-expression and bolstered essential skills applicable across diverse fields.

Throughout the 2023-24 school year, 4,394 students participated in these programs through Proposition 28 funding. The remaining schools retained their funds to avoid disruptions mid-year and initiated hiring in the spring for the 2024-25 school year.
