Citizens' Oversight Committee (COC) of the Cajon Valley Union School District

Minutes Unadopted

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the Citizens' Oversight Committee was called to order by Sheri Runyen on October 5, 2022 at 03:30 p.m. via Zoom.

Members Present: Steve Devan, Susan Holtz, Robert (Bob) Kiesling, Sheri Runyen, and Lori Trim. Apologies: Joe Wade and Peter Lupo.

District Staff: Chris Ayers, Scott Buxbaum, Sharon Clay, Sharon Dobbins, Vickie Hayman, John Heredia, and Lisa Krueger.

WELCOME, ROLL CALL

Sheri called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone, thanking them for their attendance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes from the May 11, 2022 meeting were approved on a motion made by Steve, seconded by Sheri, and carried 5-0.

BUDGET & PROJECT UPDATES

Prop EE Bond Fund:

Sharon reviewed the technology bonds, reminding everyone that the initial authorization was \$20 million, approved by voters in 2016, which was specifically for classroom technology. The first issuance was for \$6 million, used to purchase the first round of technology devices in early 2017. In October of 2019, the second issuance was for \$7 million, and shortly thereafter, the pandemic began. The District has been able to use federal stimulus funds for new student devices, allowing the bond funds to last longer, leaving an uncommitted technology bond fund balance as of June 30, 2022 of \$6,164,663.41 million.

Sharon mentioned that arbitrage rules limit the allowable interest earnings on bond funds. The IRS requires any excess interest earned (arbitrage) to be refunded within five years of the issue date of the bonds. The District uses a financial consultant to complete the required computations and determine the District's arbitrage liability. Interest earnings are not spent until these computations are completed and the District excess earnings have been refunded.

Scott shared that the current stimulus funds are expected to last through this and next year.

Scott and Jon further shared information regarding the use of E-Rate funds and the benefits to the District in assisting with technological infrastructure costs.

Prop C Bond Fund:

Sharon reviewed the Bond Program Budget Report ending fiscal year June 30, 2022, noting that the only revenue added over the course of the bond program was from the interest earned of \$25,517.

Sharon discussed the current and remaining projects:

- Erosion Control: The District is attempting to identify a solution for erosion issues at Crest.
- Middle School Locker Room Upgrades: Upgrades are planned for all middle school locker rooms
 for safe egress and compliance with current code. John shared that the bid was awarded for four
 of the middle schools. The two remaining middle schools, Cajon Valley and Hillsdale Middle
 Schools, will go out to bid shortly.
- Security Lighting: the District-wide exterior security lighting project has been completed.
 - Scott shared that the District is also looking into a key-card (keyless) system for points of entry. This would enable all employees to enter through any door, which would be especially helpful for emergency situations.
- Contingency: Savings from the completed projects identified in the report have been moved to contingency, along with the interest earned. The remaining contingency/project savings will be used for additional high-priority projects, which includes facilities for the expansion of Transitional Kindergarten (TK), and upgrades to Hillsdale Middle School's multipurpose building.

MEMBER TERMS

Sharon reviewed members' terms. Each member is allowed to serve three consecutive 2-year terms. Peter's 3rd term ends 1/31/23, and the vacancy for a parent representative has been posted on the District's website, with applications being accepted through November 30, 2022. Bob's 3rd term ends on 5/31/23.

At the previous COC meeting, the meeting frequency was changed to semi-annual, since the volume of projects is slowing down. With this, the next meeting will be April 5, 2023. A draft Annual Report will be sent to COC members to review prior to the next COC meeting, and will be further reviewed at the meeting.

DISCUSSION / OTHER

Bob inquired as to discontinuing the use of the AccountAbility Project Management System now that bond projects are coming to an end, potentially resulting in cost savings. Sharon indicated that the cost of using AccountAbility is based on a percentage of the budgeted costs, along with a small fee each year. Although this program has been very helpful, District staff is able to do the remaining reporting and program management. Therefore, the District is discontinuing its use of the program.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 4:11 p.m.

The independent Citizens' Oversight Committee (COC) was appointed by Cajon Valley Union School District's Governing Board to inform the public concerning District's voter-approved bond programs.

This annual report to the community provides financial data and project status information for both the school construction bond program and the educational technology bond program.

The construction bond program is nearing completion, and the District is using project savings to complete additional high priority projects.

The educational technology bond program has been extended further than originally planned due to Federal stimulus funds, which the District was able to apply to classroom technology devices.

Independent financial and performance audit reports were performed in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards as prescribed by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. As in all past years, results were favorable with no instances of non-compliance.

2022 PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- ♦ Hillsdale MS Multi-purpose Building Upgrades: Design began on upgrades to Hillsdale Middle School's Multi-purpose Building.
- ♦ Locker Room Upgrades/Safe Egress: Upgrades were made for safe egress and compliance with current code.





- ♦ **Security Lighting:** The District-wide exterior, LED motion-controlled lighting project was completed.
- Sevick School Renovations: Preliminary planning began for the remodel of Sevick Special Education Preschool. Contingency funds are being used for design development and cost estimating.
- Classroom Technology (Prop EE short-term technology bonds): A majority of the classroom technology device purchases originally budgeted from Prop EE funds were purchased using Federal Stimulus funds. Current Prop EE funding is being set aside for future replacements.

PLANNED FOR 2023

- ⇒ **Hillsdale MS Multi-purpose Building Upgrades:** Hillsdale Middle School's Multi-purpose Building upgrades will be completed in 2023.
- ⇒ Sevick School Renovations: Design development and cost estimating will be completed in 2023.
- ⇒ **Contingency:** Remaining contingency/project savings will be used for additional high-priority projects.
- ⇒ Classroom Technology (Prop EE short-term technology bonds): Student computers will continue to be purchased using available Federal Stimulus funds. Prop EE funds will be used for other classroom technology device replacements such as teacher computers, projectors and document cameras.

COMPLETED PROJECTS

Anza Elementary School — New Classroom Buildings: Six old portable classrooms were replaced with



new, permanent classroom buildings, which include restrooms, and learning support spaces. A new playground was also added. The new buildings were

occupied in August 2019.



Cajon Valley Middle
School Rebuilding
Project: Construction
of the final new building
was completed in
August 2011. This

project, which completes the rebuilding of the entire school campus, consists of 20 classrooms, a library, and serving kitchen.

Clock Systems: New Clock Systems were installed at Anza, Chase, Fuerte, Hall, Johnson, Madison, Magnolia, Meridian, and Naranca Elementary Schools, as well as, Emerald and Greenfield Middle Schools, and EJE Charter Academy.

Electrical Upgrades: Electrical upgrade projects were completed over the Summer 2010 at Chase Elementary, Madison Elementary and Emerald Middle School.

Fencing Projects: Fencing enhancements were completed at all schools to improve security.

Heating Ventilation & Air Conditioning Replacements: The HVAC replacements were completed each summer at the following sites: Anza, Chase, Crest, Madison, Meridian and Naranca in 2010; Emerald, Flying Hills, Fuerte, Johnson, Magnolia, and Rancho San Diego in 2011; EJE/Cuyamaca in 2012; Vista Grande in 2013; Bostonia and Montgomery in 2016.

Johnson Elementary School — New Classroom Buildings: Nine old portable classrooms were replaced with a new, permanent 2-story classroom building, which include restrooms, and learning support spaces. The new building was occupied in September 2020.

Lexington Elementary School — Rebuilding: This



new school was constructed adjacent to the original (60-year old) school on the existing 9 acre campus. The original school buildings served as

interim housing during construction, and were demolished when the new facility was completed in summer 2015.

Lighting Retrofits: Energy efficient lighting was installed at all sites.

Magnolia Elementary School — New Classroom Building and Renovations: Old portable classroom

buildings were removed and replaced with a new building, which included: 8 classrooms; 2 staff restrooms; and 2 office/ small group instruction



spaces. The renovations include: multipurpose building remodeling; kitchen expansion; creation of additional small group instruction spaces and a library/maker space; as well as, classroom and playground renovations.

Minor Renovations: Minor Renovations were completed at Bostonia, Chase, Flying Hills, Fuerte, Hall, Johnson, Madison, Magnolia, Naranca, and Rios Elementary Schools, as well as Hillsdale Middle School and Sevick Preschool. The renovations were primarily remodeling/reconfigurations to increase security.

COMPLETED PROJECTS (continued)

Modernization — Rancho San Diego: The Rancho San



Diego Modernization project was completed in September 2012. This project included renovation of the existing campus, as well as replacement of three portable classroom buildings

with new steel/wood-framed modular classrooms, including restrooms. Additional remodeling to move the office to the front of the campus, for improved security, was completed in the summer of 2017.

Modernization – Vista Grande: The Vista Grande modernization project, which included renovation of the existing campus, as well as replacement of four portable classroom buildings with new steel/wood-framed modular classrooms, was substantially completed over the summer of 2012. New porticos and accessible parking improvements were completed over winter break of 2012/2013. Additional remodeling to move the office to the front of the campus, for improved security, was completed in the summer of 2017.

Multipurpose Building Expansion — Flying Hills Elementary School: 1162 sq. ft. was added to the multipurpose building, as well as, a 1162 sq. ft. basement below for storage of props and costumes. Construction began in October 2009 and was completed in April 2010.

Naranca Elementary School — New Classroom Buildings: Seven old portable classrooms were replaced



with new, permanent classroom buildings, which include restrooms, and learning support spaces. The new buildings were occupied in August 2021.

New Gymnasium/ Multipurpose Building/ Administration & Kitchen Buildings (Emerald Middle School) This project, which includes a new



indoor gymnasium/ multipurpose building, locker rooms, kitchen, lunch shelter, and school office was constructed using the design-build

procurement method. The new buildings were occupied in August 2016.

New Gymnasium / Multipurpose Building (Greenfield Middle School): This project, which

includes: a
gymnasium;
locker rooms;
theater; music/
band room;
serving kitchen;



school offices; and six classrooms, was completed April 2013.

New Gymnasium & Renovation (Montgomery Middle School): The Montgomery Middle School project includes: a new gymnasium/multipurpose building:



swimming pool, tennis court, and locker room renovations; painting; reroofing; new classroom skylights; and landscape/ hardscape improvements. The project was completed in summer/fall 2015.

COMPLETED PROJECTS (continued)

Parking Lot Upgrades: Parking lot upgrades were completed at Avocado and WD Hall Elementary Schools in 2013.

Playground Upgrades: New playground equipment was installed at Anza, Meridian, Naranca, and W.D. Hall Elementary Schools in summer 2009. Blossom Valley Elementary School playground upgrades were completed in



summer 2010. Additionally, new playground equipment was installed at Lexington and Magnolia elementary schools as part of the new construction projects at those sites.

Security Cameras: Security cameras were installed at Anza, Avocado, Bostonia, Flying Hills, Hall, Johnson, Madison, and Naranca Elementary Schools and Cajon Valley, Emerald, Greenfield, Hillsdale, and Montgomery Middle Schools from 2009 through 2017.

Security Lighting: Exterior, LED motion-controlled lighting was installed at 22 of the District's 27 campuses. The remaining 5 campuses are scheduled to be completed in 2022.

Sidewalk/Walkway Replacements: Old, cracked walkways were replaced with new concrete walkways at Greenfield Middle School.

Technology (Infrastructure): Technology infrastructure upgrades were completed at all schools. The upgrades include: cabling; data storage and management system; IDF

(Intermediate Distribution Frame) and MDF (Main Distribution Frame) equipment room modifications; campus-wide wireless access; infrastructure for Internetaccessible projectors; and



Technology (Educational Technology): Short-term bonds were used to fund a portion of the cost for educational technology devices for the District-wide I:I initiative.

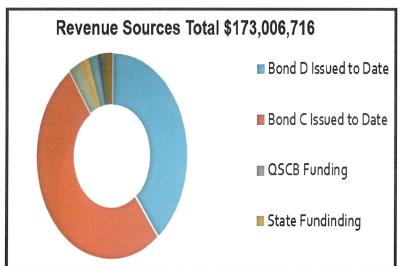
Waterline Project: A new waterline was installed at Meridian Elementary in Spring 2008.

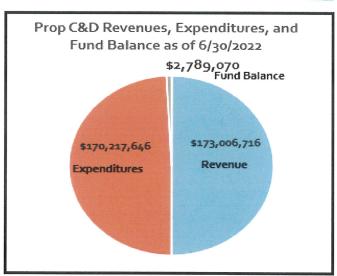
Window Replacements: Windows were replaced at Blossom Valley Elementary, Jamacha Elementary and Hillsdale Middle School from 2016 to 2018.

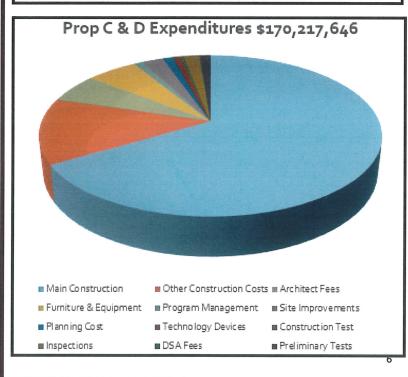
