The group went into breakout rooms for small group discussions...

Room 1 - Grateful to work together so well. We all transitioned so well. Looking forward to seeing more processes becoming smoother. Graciousness toward each other's departments and patience for everyone.

David Miyashiro shared about surveying parents soon about returning to school. Tamara Otero will be meeting with parent groups at each school to get their feedback and how to staff schools. We will be extending the childcare program.

Michelle Hayes shared the heart of all the work is the classified staff. We are going to rock it!

David Miyashiro shared he is on a weekly call with all San Diego superintendents and they ask about how to return staff to work. We share all our employees are essential.
