- (Sheri) Adjustment period, son is self-motivator, parents working all through this, son
 wants to be back at school, wants to go to his classes with HIS teachers, advisors is a
 good start, but would like to see his own teachers
- (Josie) 8th grader finishing up at Cajon Valley, students don't find it beneficial, kids are struggling with the science for 8th grade, learn better in the school setting, missing th learning
- (Kristy) 6th grader and 8th grader, work for 6th grader done in minutes, not beneficial because she's in honors, not challenging enough or personalized enough; 8th grader is not completing any work that is "optional", gets nothing from it, on zoom calls and does assignments as needed, has not had a good experience with some teachers at the school, math teacher has not reached out, likes to hear from content area teachers; teacher by teacher experience- some doing bare minimum (just playlists) and students are getting nothing; likes the plan of student going to Cathedral- 2 days a week at school and 2 days a week at home, lessons recorded of teachers; prefer to see kids on campus a couple days a week and at home a couple days a week; does not want to see a playlist that looks the same for every kid
