Hybrid: Parent Square App - zero missed communication. 5-6 updates on what is going on in the school. Teacher uses it so they can check the app. Having 2 teachers for her child this communication has kept her in the loop.
Hybrid 1st grader. Curiosity of A / B model. Deep clean between groups is this more work? (Response -desks cleaned during the day, at end of the day and the beginning of the next day / Back to Back would be three days of no teacher contact - this provided more consistency)
We are Cora (Pendell) and Mia's tang's (Barnes) parents. Hybrid is working well for us. We like the low capacity in the classroom. One complaint that we have is the different messaging system (class dojo, parent square, etc). We prefer Parent Square. Pick up and drop off is working great. I've been really impressed with the safety measures the school has put in place.
Keep students in school at least 2 days a week - it does wonders for them mentally. They get to see

	School is a social environment where students learn to socialize. Device being the only tool to friends and mentors/teachers has trained them to socially inept long term.
	Friends in Santee that are learning to write with fingers versus doing a packet and doing something tangible.
→What's not?	Keeping the students focused when they are at home. Student managing time when on apps.
	Taking books back and forth to school. Backpack is heavy.
	Personalization of education which is hard right now only being at school 2 days a week. Opportunities for doing harder work.
→ What should we try to improve?	Multiple types of communication - maybe just use one tool - especially if there are multiple students.
	Putting videos in Google Classroom versus playlists - may work better.
	Playlists - they do help keep it in one place.
	Bring back cursive - stimulates the brain and creativity.

→ What's working?	Hybrid: getting students their work, engaged, less absences, socialization, small group instruction
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	has been beneficial for both teaching and student engagement, smaller class size, less behavior issues, morning arrival procedure, students who normally wouldn't participate are participating more in the smaller class size, students feel more comfortable in a small group.
→ What's not?	Zoom not working with technical issues, online issues with programs, keeping students motivated, social distancing at dismissal and lunch, Students not meeting IEP minutes because they are using computers for recreational purposes, changes in the schedule from online to hybrid, students struggling with changes, limited social interaction, inequality and inconsistency with rules on the playground, students are doing other things on their computers during instructional time, hard for teachers to constantly be on blocksi while simultaneously teaching,
→ What should we try to improve?	School is telling staff/families about cases that haven't been finalized and that is stressing people out, Social distancing, communication between admin to staff and parents, When eating outside, put dividers between students during lunch, maybe more dividers in classroom, open side gate at end of the day, less waste of food at breakfast and lunch with more options
→ What should we stop doing?	Only having one dismissal location: add another place for kids to be picked up so not all students are congregating in the front
